



Old Business

New Field

Bryan, again, presented a poster board drawing of the proposed new field at Camp Brinkley. He laid out the basic outline of the entire area as well as a few of the significant land marks. Those include the barn and the road. He also drew out his proposed location for the runway. Additionally he laid out his expectation for the build out schedule.

The news for the day is that the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) is only asking for a Hold Harmless agreement from us.

The board had gathered a week previous to the meeting to discuss the proposal to the members about the field itself and what we would like to suggest being presented to the BSA as an agreement. Tim Shegrud presented this to the members in attendance.

- No other entity will occupy or use the field without prior agreement
- Rent should be \$1.00 per year plus merit badge seminars planned 3 months ahead
- A request to vacate the field will be made a minimum of 1 year before prior to deadline
- Soil and materials will be provided by the BSA for field development
- We agree to maintain an area approximately 600' X 400' immediately east of the barn
- BSA will allow BBMAC the use of the water and power already located on the property
- BBMAC will provide insurance as offered by the AMA
- BSA will assist us in notifying the neighbors of our intentions for use of the field
- BBMAC should have no official restrictions on flying times
- BBMAC will provide advance notice of any flying events at the field
- This agreement should stand for 10 years

The board then opened the floor to questions or additional suggestions.

What is to come of the barn? Is there anything inside we need to be concerned with?

The BSA has asked if we could dispose of the barn structure itself (burn it down?). Although there are a few things in the barn (including but not limited to a yard tractor like our mower) there is nothing that is expected to be left there after we take occupation of the field.

What is the traffic like on the road that bisects the field? Estimations are that there are fewer than 3 cars per hour.

What about storage at the field? Camp Brinkley has a shed they are no longer using and are looking to get rid of. They have offered to let us have it for our storage shed. Transportation of the shed from where it is to our field has already been offered.

Could the ground floor of the barn be used for

storage or whatever? The ground floor is usable

The field on the north side of the road is mostly swamp. If a plane goes down it may be irretrievable.

Are there any limitations to the improvements we can make? At this point there has been no mention of any limitations.

How high is the water table at worse? We don't know.

Nominations for officers

This is the time we elect our officers for the coming year. After reviewing the members nominated for office so far the floor was opened up to additional nominations. The following are the results.

President: Scott Curtis officially declined his nomination but Chet Blake accepted a last minute nomination and is running unopposed

Secretary: Tim Shegrud was nominated and Rick Hanners, also, accepted a last minute nomination

Treasurer: Ron Swift is running unopposed. Safety officer: Vince Bell is running unopposed

The board neglected to hold nominations for the special service award, so the award was left open for an all write in vote.

Safety Corner



Here we are at beginning of another year. We were very fortunate last year we didn't have any major injuries, let's keep it that way for the 2014 flying season.

Keep in mind, in the winter we wear heavier clothes and for the most part, loose fitting coats with bulky sleeves. Be careful around the propeller. Most of the time all that happens is an embarrassing hole in the coat, but it can be much, much worse. If you are that close to the prop you had better re-think how you are doing things.

I know that I have hit on this subject before, not that I'm picking on the electric guys, (well may be a little). When you are ready to connect the battery and arm the system, make sure your plane is secure. and you are following all the Cautions, Dangers and other Warnings. You know, the first 96 pages that the manufacturer has detailed in the operators manual that came with the ESC and motor. With the ESCs that I have, you [initially leave the propeller off!!!], turn on the Transmitter before connecting the battery then put the throttle lever to high speed and then back to low speed and the thing will beep a few times, when you next advance the throttle the motor will go. Remember you can inadvertently move the throttle lever by other means. Know and pay attention to what you are doing. When you land disconnect the battery before turning off the transmitter.


In this respect electrics are far more dangerous than the internal combustion engines.

When setting up a new electric airplane in the shop leave the propeller off until you are sure that the propeller shaft is turning in the right direction - usually counter clockwise if you are looking at the shaft from the front of the airplane. Then and only then install the propeller and for the first test - Still make sure the airplane is secured so it cannot move forward or backwards. Check that the area around the propeller area is clear of debris. A propeller will suck loose stuff in from a surprising distance and throw it with force a surprising distance.

There are many other things we use that have rotating mass. Like the cut-off wheels we use on the Dremel tools. Stay out of the rotational plane of these. They are very easily shattered (as anyone that uses them knows). Better to use the re-enforced type all though they do make wider kerfs, require more power and generate more heat. When you're grinding and cutting always wear safety glasses with side shields.

Let's keep it safe this year.








Barnyard Buzzard's Club Meeting

Barnyard Buzzards Pilot Training



Use of a computer simulator is advisable. This allows you to practice safely and will end up saving you hundreds of dollars in the long run.

Still, in any case, the best way to learn to fly R/C planes is by finding an instructor to help. Learning on your own can be expensive and somewhat less safe

We provide instruction for both building model aircraft as well as flying these models. In most cases, a buddy box system is used at the flying field. Experience has shown this to be the safest method to learn.

Those who want to enroll in the pilot training should contact our club secretary, **Tim Baird (360) 348-6033**. Pilots already enrolled in the training program are welcome to contact any of these club
