
#### President's Message — Mark Weeks

#### **Special Committee Reports**

### Port-a-potty committee – [Grant, Dart and Mark]

Dart talked to the guy offering to sell the units the same type as used in Snohomish. They are \$750 each and \$600 to get the two shipped here. The shipping cost is guaranteed for 7 to 14 days, but the shipping costs are increasing very fast. If we're going to do it, we should do it now. We allocated \$1500.00 for the units, but we will need another \$600 to get them here. Dart also mentioned he told the sales guy he would tell him tomorrow whether we are going to do it. A motion was made to increase the allocation for the port-a -potties by \$600 to cover the shipping cost. The motion was seconded. Discussion – Question when would these arrive? Answer the guy said he'd get them here by the end of January. We will need to get them off the truck. We also will need to assemble them. The amended allocation of \$2100 for two units passed unanimously. The units are coming from Tennessee.

#### **Field Management Team**

Jay Bell has announced that he needs to pass the job of Field Manager to someone else due to the workload he has at home. Bryan also announced that he needs to play a lesser role due to moving to Anacortes. We asked for someone to step into this role in the past meetings and at the events, but so far no one stepped forward. Mark said if OK with the club membership, he would assume

the role for now and ask for help with projects as they need to be done. Bryan would continue to be the point of contact with the scouts. The Field Manager is not currently an elected position, but appointed. So, if anyone wants the position or wants to help, please speak up! There were no volunteers and no discussion.

# **Announcements/Discussions/Info Sharing**



# Safety Corner

Thank you for electing me as your Safety Officer for 2022. I shall do my best to promote our hobby while minimizing the risk to life, limb, and property.

Ours isn't a particularly safe hobby. Most of our contraptions involve some type of whirling meat slicer. We send these infernal machines aloft with high hopes they will return to earth in similar condition and location as when they left. There are many possibilities for trouble. Failure is always an option. It is our job to reduce the risk by being vigilant about the condition of our aircraft and the way we use them. It is also our job to remain alert when at our field as to what others are (or aren't) doing. While you are busy complaining to your buddy about how everyone should park the way you do be aware of who is flying and what they are doing. When you are hunched over your model in the pits trying to figure out why your latest greatest radio won't bind with your receiver and your back is facing the runway keep an eye and ear open for activity. Even being in the pits can be a hazardous place. Engines can kick back during starting

and propellors go flying by themselves. Electric powered aircraft always possesses the possibility of starting without warning due to malfunction or far more likely human error.

Our club is fairly easy going compared to other model flying clubs. Many of us prefer the relaxed atmosphere. But this doesn't mean we can afford to be relaxed about safety. As model airmen it is our responsibility to keep ourselves and others safe to protect ourselves and the future of our club and hobby.

Ron, John and Tom would arrive at the field and park facing NE to make it easier to leave later.. Ron Stout would be the fifth one to arrive, usually right after Ron Swift, John Rennert and Tom Fixel .

When it was cold out both Rons would start up their propane heaters. Otherwise the 5 weekday flyers would start assembling their models and start the kibitzing:

**Kibitzing**—look on and offer unwelcome advice, especially at a card game or speak informally; chat. (Definition from the internet).

Next, George Anderson (no relation to Steve) and Maine Tonkin would arrive.

We would increase the banter and talk about modeling. Ron Stout talked about SIG and their tarty delivery of parts and kits. Ron liked to fly his Dolphin, Fourstar 40 and the Ultimate Biplane. He mentioned having a new SIG kit for the building season we're in now and fixing up some previously flown models. Most of the darnage was due to a landing gear failure, amazingly like ours, too. We go good at fixing these issues.

The photos are some from our twice a week get together experiences. Ron seemed to like working with alcohol engines and even helped with some of my gasoline two stroke engines. He also helped to retrieve the 90-inch plus airplanes. Thank you, Ron, for the great friendship and flying experiences we all shared!

#### 25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the next right to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the left at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the right. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive....


