

New Business

Proposed practice fly-in at field Jennifer owns. A set date has not been established.

Rick Hanners reviewed the proposed 2010 budget. Rick presented a proposed 2010 budget. He talked about some of the differences between 2009 and 2010. The major difference is a proposed rent increase to \$1,500.00 in anticipation of a new field. The increase in field rent pushes our finances into the red, should the budget align to actual expenses. A motion was made to accept the proposed 2010 budget. The motion was seconded, voted on, and passed.

Revision in event fees. In the past, members entering an event were required to pay \$5.00. The fee covered the event and lunch. Now, lunch will not be included in the event fee. Additionally, the person responsible for coordinating the event will be required to collect receipts and money, which will be submitted to the treasurer.

Revision to meeting dates. A proposal was made to move the monthly meetings to the second Tuesday of the month. There are several holidays throughout the year that either conflict with our meeting dates or are close enough that attendance is affected. This proposed revision was opened for discussion. A motion was made to move the March meeting to March 9th and the subsequent meetings to be held on the second Tuesday of the month. The motion was seconded, voted on, and passed. As a reminder, the February 2010 meeting will still be on 2/2/2010.

Builder's Competition 2009-2010 Rules

- Entries can be made by any club member in good standing.
- Each model is considered an entry and will have a \$10.00 fee.
- Payment along with the name of the model can be submitted to any board member or event judge.

- Event judges and ruling body will be comprised of 4 members plus the Vice President.
- These members are not yet named, but new judges for each year would be a great idea!
- Judges cannot judge their own plane.
- You must build the model yourself.
- Two main categories (others such as wet fuel vs. other may also emerge as we progress):
 - ♦ ARF♦ Stick
 - Stick build (plans or kits)
- You must beat someone to win (must have other entries in the same category).
- You can finish the model you previously entered, but didn't complete.
- New models must be started after the May judging club meeting (end of the previous competition).
- Two special awards voted on by the attendees of the May meeting:
 - In the Bones (award to the best model started, but not finished)
 - Members Choice Award
- Prizes will be color plaques of the winners and models.
- You must have fun!
- Extra points awarded if the model is flown before the May meeting.
- A write up of the model including the wingspan, weight, modifications, power, etc. would be helpful.
- Questions should be directed to the judges or Vice President, who is the responsible events coordinator.

Buzzard Droppings February 2010



Here we are the second month of a New Year. It was just a few weeks ago that Ron was nudging me to get the February 2009 newsletter safety column written.

We had the 2nd Annual Freeze-In a couple weeks ago and as usual the weather was great. Not what you would think a Freeze-In should be. The temperature was in the high 50s low 60s, with no wind.

This brings up a minor safety issue. When there are several fliers **PLEASE** use the same landing pattern except in an emergency. Most pilots seem to prefer the right to left pattern wind permitting of course. So on a nice calm day land and take-off from the right.

Another thing. Before you **carry** your airplane to the runway for take-off look around and get feel for the traffic situation. **Landing traffic always has** **the right-of-way**. If you are near a running engine it is impossible to hear another pilot call out his landing so look around for landing traffic. Also, use the pilot stations, we have four for a reason. Maximum of 4 planes in the air at a time (Club rule).

I have said this a million times always use common sense when around a running engine.

<u>The picture below left is how not to pick</u> <u>your airplane off the table, the picture on the</u> <u>right below is a much safer method.</u>

Having a helper pick up your running model is likely the safest yet. That way you won't get antennas, etc. in the prop arc.

Never pick up a running plane from the front.... One of our members did just that and was lucky to get away with a small cut on his arm from the prop. I asked Chet to demo this, but he wouldn't do it with the engine running. Also, adjust the carb and remove the glow igniter from behind the running prop! Never reach over the prop! Picking the plane up from behind or starting the engine with the model restrained on the ground is so much safer.


Making all carb adjustments and glow starter removal from behind the spinning propeller is the safe thing to do!

<u>Having a medical kit with you is also a</u> good thing, no matter how you pick up your model.










Horizon Hobbies and others advised against replacing the PCM10X NICAD batteries (or NIMH) with a LI Poly pack battery mentioning that a fully charged LI Poly battery is over 12 VDC. A new NiCad battery pack for the PCM10X costs \$74.00. A LI Poly battery is about \$15.00. I bought 3 of them and replaced all three PCM10X batteries with these. So far, no problems. There was a small mention of this in the latest AMA Magazine. I use the Triton charger to charge these.

Our club is dedicated to the safe pursuit and advancement of model aviation. We offer the newcomer free lessons to learn how to build models and to fly them. If you should have any questions about the club, flight instruction or membership requirements, call any of the club officers. We have a safety checklist available for those new to our flying field.

Use of a computer simulator is advisable. This allows you to practice safely and will end up saving you hundreds of dollars in the long run.

Still, in any case, the best way to learn to fly R/C planes is by finding an instructor to help. Learning on your own can be expensive and somewhat less safe.

We provide instruction for both building model aircraft as well as flying these models. In most cases, a buddy box system is used at the flying field. Experience has shown this to be the safest method to learn.
