Jim announced that the next meeting is the builder's contest. This will be held on May 10. So far there are four entries. And that the June meeting will be the charity auction.

**Treasurer** – Rick Hanners reported that the Buzzards are in good shape financially. There are 57 members currently.

**Safety officer** – Vince spoke briefly stating that the trees to the west are getting tall, and we should watch out and possibly take a higher approach for our landings.

#### **Announcements**

Bryan called for announcements:

The Zillah Fly-In is at the end of April. Friday will be a potluck. Saturday will be brisket beef, crab, and barbecue pork. It should be a lot of fun.

Bryan announced that the Island Recover Service does not function when the river is flooded.

The Northwest Electric Fly-In at 60 acres is going to be at the end of April as well. Bryan will be attending. He is interested in how other clubs run and handle their events.

#### **Old Business**

Bryan then called for old business:

<u>Visitors: local and from out of the area.</u> As in the past, we do have visitors stopping by the field. Be courteous and aware of their presence. A visitor had stopped by the name Dave. He is a former flyer and has some old kits and balsa for sale. Some of the items had been his father's and are quite old. He had a box full of some of the kits and said he had more in his trunk.

East end of the field flying. The house resident talked to Dale about a plane flying over the house last Saturday. Let's use this is a reminder to watch our no-fly zone. Someone suggested permanently coloring the arrow and pole, perhaps, using different colored streamers or maybe adding a wind sock on top of the pole. Additionally a proposal was presented to communicate with the resident of the house such that if a plane were to fly over the house to immediately come down and talk to us. However, Dale seems to want to field all the issues concerning our flying field. If we are to have no direct contact with his residents, then, maybe, we could ask Dale for permission to contact the house occupants to discuss flight issues.

Someone reminded us that the residents have only been here for a little less than a year.

Field update. Dale will be planting corn and then will not go into field until harvest. He then suggested that we add a second pole to assist with the lineup for approaches. After some discussion we came to the conclusion that if it were recommended by Dale we should seriously consider the suggestion - if there's no harm in doing it than we should use the suggestion. There was a fairly lively debate about where we would put this poll: perhaps three fourths of the way to the trestle about 6 feet tall, just a bit higher than the corn. There was a suggestion of using an ATV flag, this would be an 8 foot pole with an orange pennant and this work can be scheduled during the work party.

<u>Field weather station</u>. At the last meeting there was a suggestion of putting up a weather station at the field. Jack has purchased the meter and other devices for wind and direction and is waiting for the free electronics. We will then need to have volunteers to take measurements every once in while on a schedule and then upload them to the website.

<u>By-laws revision</u>. Rick made a motion to accept the By-Law changes outlined in the previous month's meeting and newsletter.

Current wording, "In no case will the dues for a new Full Member be less than a \$100.00 non-refundable fee that will include the first year's annual dues as established by the membership. The \$100.00 new membership fee will not apply to a new Family,

This motion was presented to the floor and approved with no discussion.

Show and Tell Bryan presented his newest airplane. He had a lot of trouble trying to get the plane to fly long enough for him to trim the airplane. After many, many attempts he finally asked Brian Taylor to see if he could trim out the airplane. The plane required a fair amount of aileron trim in order to fly straight. However, it does fly well and very fast. The lesson in this case was "asking for help often leads to success".

<u>Evening Program</u>. Scott presented a program on flight patterns and landing approaches. He detailed a lot of the practices and procedures, or even techniques a full size aircraft uses in landing patterns and approaches and discussed how these can relate to our radio control aircraft.

The meeting officially adjourned at 8:45 P.M. The next meeting is Tuesday, May 10, 2011, at our flying field in Monroe at 6:30 P.M.

HOLY COW! The sun is out, at least for a couple of days. What do we do?

Do we throw the stuff in the car and head for the field? Sounds to me like an event about to happen that may not be what we were looking for.

We should charge the batteries that have been setting around all winter. It has been a long one, and recycle them to make sure they are up to snuff, if not replace them.

While you are in there look over everything else that may go haywire. Like the fuel tank, it might be a good idea to remove it and inspect the plumbing inside. Replace the hoses if they have gotten hard. Make sure the stopper is still soft and pliable so when you tighten it down it will not leak.

Look over all the wiring, unplug all the servos, extensions and all the connection to the receiver making sure that they have not corroded and gotten yucky.

Check all the control linkages and make sure they are serviceable. Verify that the control horns are tight and in good shape. This includes checking the hinges for security and looseness.

Check the vertical and horizontal stabilizers making sure they haven't suffered some hanger damage over the winter. If you use rubber bands to secure your wings make sure they are serviceable or better yet get new ones.

Check the engine mount. Make sure the engine is bolted to the engine mount. Make sure the propeller is in good shape, not nicked or cracked. If it is a wood prop, verify that it is not crushed, then re-torque it.

If there are holes in the covering fix them.
Unless you find a lot wrong, this won't
take long and is good insurance that the
most common things are caught and taken
care of before the first flight of the spring.

Keep up on the maintenance and you will have a lot more fun and not be out in the corn field picking up parts.

Oh, and by the way RANGE CHECK YOUR SYSTEM PRIOR TO THE FIRST FLIGHT!

## **Builder's Competition 2010-2011 Rules**

- Entries can be made by any club member in good standing.
- Each model is considered an entry and will have a \$10.00 fee.
- Payment along with the name of the model can be submitted to any board member or event judge.
- Event judges and ruling body will be comprised of 4 members plus the Vice President.

  These members are not yet named, but new judges for each year would be a great idea!
- Judges cannot judge their own plane.
- · You must build the model yourself.
- Two main categories (others such as wet fuel vs. other may also emerge as we progress):
  - ♦ ARF
  - ♦ Stick build (plans or kits)
- You must beat someone to win (must have other entries in the same category).
- You can finish the model you previously entered, but didn't complete.
- New models must be started after the May judging club meeting (end of the previous competition).
- Two special awards voted on by the attendees of the May meeting:
  - ♦ In the Bones (award to the best model started, but not finished)
  - Members Choice Award
- Prizes will be color plaques of the winners and models or gift certificated—winner's choice.
- You must have fun!
- Extra points awarded if the model is flown before or during the May meeting.
- A write up of the model including the wingspan, weight, modifications, power, etc. would be helpful.
- Questions should be directed to the judges or Vice President, who is the responsible events coordinator.

# Barnyard Buzzards Pilot Training

Our club is dedicated to the safe pursuit and advancement of model aviation. We offer the newcomer free lessons to learn how to build models and to fly them. If you should have any questions about the club, flight instruction or membership requirements, call any of the club officers. We have a safety checklist available for those new to our flying field.

Use of a computer simulator is advisable. This allows you to practice safely and will end up saving you hundreds of dollars in the long run.

Still, in any case, the best way to learn to fly R/C planes is by finding an instructor to help. Learning on your own can be expensive and somewhat less safe.

We provide instruction for both building model aircraft as well as flying these models. In most cases, a buddy box system is used at the flying field. Experience has shown this to be the safest method to learn.
