### **Old Business**

### AMA Flying Site Grant Application

BBMAC received the site improvement grant in full. (Special thanks to Rick for providing the financial reporting used as part of the application.) This also means we are expected to give updates on the progress of our field every 6 months until done.

### Flying Field status.

A meeting has been scheduled with Arleen for Sunday the 19<sup>th</sup>. The board expects at that time to finalize terms for renting the field (or not) through April 2014. Possible outcomes range from adding 5/8" minus rock to the access road as rent payment to vacating the

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field immediately.

### The board's position:

- It is the board's recommendation that the club should continue occupying the present field with Arleen's acceptance of BBMAC requested conditions listed below. The board believes not having a club field to fly from would be detrimental to the club.
- It is also the board's position that if our landlord's acceptance of the following conditions (in some reasonable form) is not met, the club should vacate the field immediately without paying any form of rent. If terms cannot be agreed upon the board believes our situation will only deteriorate so why bother paying anything to stay.

Board recommended conditions are as follows:

- Agreed days of the week for locking the gate at FBR shall be Mon. & Wed. (Tues will be reserved as a negotiable item.)
- FBR gate to remain unlocked Thurs Sun and the second Tues. of each month June – Sept.
- Aircraft will not be flown while Hero's are present.
- The gate at SR 2 will never be locked.
- 24 yrds of 5/8" minus rock placed and graded by BBMAC will suffice as rent through April 2014. BBMAC shall vacate prior to the end of April 2014.

The goal here is to maintain use of the flying field for the next year for as little money possible giving the club time to locate and develop a new flying site. But not just a new site but **The Site** that we can call home for a long time to come.

A club vote after discussing the board's recommendation will determine what the board presents to Arleen when we meet this Sunday.

Because BBMAC will lose all ability to hold our landlord accountable once rent is paid. Do we want to consider the timing for paying the rent and possible benefits for the club?

Option 1 – place rock Oct. 1<sup>st</sup>.

Option 2 - pay \$500 in cash 5/19.

Option 3 – pay \$700 in cash 10/1.)

Option 4 – Presented by the club – pay month to month as we need to use the field.

That way we do not need to ask for any money back when we leave.

Also suggest during the discussion:

Do we want to approach this as we present what we want and she can 'take it or leave it' or present some options that we can negotiate?

One other concern is that if we lay the 5/8 minus and the horses are then able to walk on Hanner's Highway, will we then have to deal with opening and closing the 4<sup>th</sup> gate?

Other points of conversation:

- Paying for and using for half a year would be acceptable
- We should lay the gravel on our own schedule to use if needed should our landlord break the conditions of our new lease agreement.
- We still have no way to control the situation; she owns the land.
- The board agrees that we should delay the payments until the end of the year to use against our landlord, if needed.

### Motions from the club membership

Motion 1 (Chet - 2<sup>nd</sup>: Dick B): We offer to purchase 24yrds 5/8 minus or pay Arleen the current cost of 24yrds 5/8 minus (\$750) with the understanding that this is a take it or leave it offer, she accepts or we walk.

This was passed without dissent
Motion 2 (Ron R – 2<sup>nd</sup> Tim S.): We propose FBR Gate unlocked Thursday –
Sunday and the second Tuesday of each month, at a minimum.

This was withdrawn

Motion 3 (Ron R - 2<sup>nd</sup>: Chet): Our presenter negotiates the best possible schedule for FBR access with absolutely no backslides.

This passed without dissent.

### **New flying field Committee**

Dale has not returned Chet's email, yet, but suggested in a conversation that we should talk to Remlinger farms

## Safety Corner

### Attitude and Altitude

I hope everyone has had a safe month.

By this time of year, we should have completed the inspection of the airplanes and repaired anything that was wrong. If not already repaired, the models should have a tag on them identifying the required repairs or parts that are needed for the repairs.

A safe attitude, not a safe altitude, is probably the most important item we can pack into our flight boxes. You can put a ton of safe attitude in your field box and it will not add any extra weight. Conversely you can also put a ton of bad (don't give a rip) attitude into the flight box and it may add more weight than you can imagine.

I know that most of us don't go the field with the idea of sticking a finger into the propeller, or have an airplane get away from us in the pits, but how

often do we think about the steps required to avoid such things?

Just some things to think about as you throw the Belch Fire Super into the car for a day at the field.

Summer is coming, so they tell me, and with more people at the field it is even more important to have the Safe Attitude packed in the field box.

Remember that Bad Attitudes and Bad Altitude have one thing in common, Bad things will happen...

Be Safe.



# Barnyard Buzzards Pilot Training

Our club is dedicated to the safe pursuit and advancement of model aviation. We offer the newcomer free lessons to learn how to build models and to fly them. If you should have any questions about the club, flight instruction or membership requirements, call any of the club officers. We have a safety checklist available for those new to our flying field.

Use of a computer simulator is advisable. This allows you to practice safely and will end up saving you hundreds of dollars in the long run.

Still, in any case, the best way to learn to fly R/C planes is by finding an instructor to help. Learning on your own can be expensive and somewhat less safe.

We provide instruction for both building model aircraft as well as flying these models. In most cases, a buddy box system is used at the flying field. Experience has shown this to be the safest method to learn.
