















Safety Corner

In my time flying with the Buzzards I have witnessed several "brown outs" or at least what where probably brown outs. They can be hard to determine before or after a crash because they only occur when certain circumstances arise.

What is a "brown out"? In general, it is a condition that occurs with electric powered aircraft that utilize an electronic speed control (ESC) with a battery eliminator circuit (BEC) that provides 4.8-6v to power your receiver and servos. When the current load of the RX (receiver) and servos exceed the maximum the BEC can provide, the voltage will drop. When it dips below a certain threshold the RX will briefly shut off. The voltage will then go back up and the RX will typically restart but will take a moment to re-connect and in that time it is very likely your aircraft will crash before everything is back to normal. If it does come back on before you crash, it is likely it will do it all again.

Older and smaller ESC's usually only provide 1-2 amps for the BEC. This is really only enough for 4 servos. With many modern airplanes using separate servos for every flight control this is simply not enough. Most modern ESC's can provide 3 amps to the BEC and this is usually enough but if you have electric retracts that run off power from the RX or particularly large loading on control surfaces (fast aircraft or large control surface), this can be a problem.

Brown outs are hard to diagnose since they rarely occur on the test bench due to there being little to no load on the servos. Even a crashed aircraft may work

after recovery. If you experience a loss of control in-flight and any other explanation is eliminated, it is likely you experienced a brown out.

Fail safe settings will often not work during a brown out since the RX has shut off. Controls will usually stay where they were when it shot off. The throttle will usually cut off but this varies with different brands and models of ESC.

How can we protect ourselves from this condition? Make sure your equipment is in good working order. If servos are buzzing when the model is sitting idle something is binding and needs attention. Make sure your BEC is adequate for the model and number of servos used. Separate BEC's are cheap and easy to get. If you use this option be sure to disable the built in BEC (if your ESC has one), as you don't want two on the same RX. For larger, more complex, heavier and usually more ex-

pensive models a separate RX battery pack is by far the best bet.

Stay safe and always help your fellow Buzzards.

25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the next right to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the left at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the right. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive....
