## **NEW BUSINESS:**

Ron made a motion for the club to pay the food costs for today's work party as this was not a previously scheduled and budgeted event. A motion was seconded and voted on. The motion passed unanimously.

Motion to enlarge the parking area 5 to

6 feet deeper. This will allow for more area between cars and flight tables. There was much discussion regarding the need to spend money and why we should or should not do it.

The main reason was to give more driveway area between flight tables and the parking area, this seems to have gotten small over the years. It also will allow a more significant safety buffer.

Len would remove approx. 80 yards of dirt in the bank project, and it then would be used to fix a couple of low areas in the south grass area and directly north of the runway to help mitigate a wet area that is hard to maintain. There was also talk on using it to work on the upper to lower driveway located south and west of the current area.

There was a motion to approval the bank cutback and at the same time move the flight safety stands and tables east of their current locations. This will be more in line with where they were originally placed. Motion Passed and Mark will contact Len to see when we can schedule the project.

Flight safety stations and tables were moved during the work party following this meeting. Please do not move them without returning to home position. Steve will send out a reminder to the club members.

There was also discussion regarding ways to separate the parking gravel from the grass field. Michael C. and Bryan R. will come up with a few ideas and plans.

Field watering - Mark shared his new sprinkler stand and how it should work. It will cover about a 75ft. radius and it's easy to move. If you show up early or later in the afternoon please set the timer for 2 hours, place the sprinkler in a new location help get the grass growing again.

Mark reported that there are still a few spots open for mowing, so please sign up.

The upper car area has been re-done a little flattened and cleaned up – Thanks Brian D. and Dart for all their hard work.

Crawler area and Ideas.... Landscape cloth covered with gravel then built on that. Help with weed control.

The need of a flat area so those with less mobility can still play. Bryan D. is working on some ideas to help make this area more maintenance free. A few ideas were to use plastic sheets vs. landscape cloth and their pros and cons.

# SHOW AND TELL:

It has been a few years since one of our members had a serious mishap. The latest one happened while flying as a guest at the Arlington Eagle's field that required a trip to the emergency room. The nature of the incident was the most common we as RC flyers have. That of trying to get hands, fingers and other body parts to occupy the same space as a turning propeller.

Interfacing with a spinning propeller is the one thing that will ruin your day quicker and more painfully than any other. We are all taught never to reach across the propeller for any reason. Yet we do and most of the time we get away with it. That is just what this fellow did on that fateful day and didn't get away with it. He is all healed up now and has been one of the regular Saturday morning flyers.

Until some other health problems came up at the Fun Fly a couple of weeks ago I noticed one of the pilots doing almost the same thing while setting the mixture adjustment on his engine. I say almost the same thing, the difference was he didn't get his finger into the prop-arc. This pilot was not a newbie and has probably been doing this same thing for years, but so had the aforementioned pilot. The difference was he got caught and the pilot at the Fun Fly didn't. THIS TIME!!

Remember make all your adjustments from the back side of the propeller and if possible with the engine not running. Never reach over the propeller to pick up your airplane. Electric guys this pertains to you, too. Treat your electrics as if they are running until you have the battery disconnected.

Another thing that this incident brought to light was, when flying know where to get emergency care, if needed, especially at a different field. Our present field is not as close to an

emergency facility as we have been accustomed to. At the new field let's be super careful and strive for a 99+ year safety record.

# 25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

**If you go the left as shown by MapQuest**, make sure you take the **<u>next right</u>** to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the <u>left</u> at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, <u>be careful as on-</u><u>coming traffic does not stop.</u>

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, <u>be careful as oncoming traffic does not</u> <u>stop</u>. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the right. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive....
