Flying For Fun
























Here are a couple of experiences to think about.

Jim, our beloved vice president, related this story to me the other day. It seems he was leaving the field via the Highway 2 exit. After checking traffic to his left and waiting for an opening he began to pull out into the west bound lane. At the same time a car pulled out of the East bound lane to pass traffic in the east bound lane, narrowly missing Jim in the west bound lane. This is a situation that I had not thought of. It is a little scary because it is a nice straight road in that area and there is always someone that has to be ahead of the car in front of them. Please be super cautious when entering Highway 2 either from the field entrance or at the east end of Fern Bluff Road.

The other day I was flying my airplane straight and level about half throttle. I'd guess the engine was turning about 5000 RPM. There was a loud bang and the engine stopped. In the landing attempt I didn't guite make it over the fence and the dead stick airplane hit one of the steel fence posts. That confrontation messed up the cowl a little, mostly cosmetic damage, but the engine was sitting at a really weird angle. Also, the end of one of the propeller blades was missing. We looked for the broken prop blade and didn't find it anywhere near the post the plane hit. The part of the blade that was still on the engine didn't look like it was broken from an impact. It looked like it was thrown off. When I got home and started looking at the firewall it didn't look like it was broken from a crash or impact with the post either.

the propeller separated while the engine was running, causing it to become severely out of balance, shaking the engine mount and fire wall from the airframe. From a safety standpoint, that's why the engine stopped and the end of the prop was missing. Since it didn't look like it was broken from an impact – the event makes me think of what could have happened on the ground while starting the engine. If someone was in line with the propeller as it let lose, it could have caused a very serious wound. When you are running up the engine or just being around an engine, be aware that something like this could happen on the ground just as well. [Actually it did and a young pilot, Joe, was astounded as my YS 91 threw off the spinner and screw last weekend! Luckily no one was hit by the flying parts.]

"A model, engine, or radio that is not prepared and working properly on the ground before takeoff will not improve in the air—IT WILL GET WORSE! There is no point in attempting to fly until everything is 100% correct." (Sig Mfg. Co., Inc.)

The other half of the flying experience equation is the pilot. Substitute pilot for "model, engine or radio" into the above, you get the point, I hope.

- All financial arrangements are between the buyer and the seller.










Our club is dedicated to the safe pursuit and advancement of model aviation. We offer the newcomer free lessons to learn how to build models and to fly them. If you should have any questions about the club, flight instruction or membership requirements, call any of the club officers. We have a safety checklist available for those new to our flying field.

Use of a computer simulator is advisable. This allows you to practice safely and will end up saving you hundreds of dollars in the long run.

Still, in any case, the best way to learn to fly R/C planes is by finding an instructor to help. Learning on your own can be expensive and somewhat less safe.

We provide instruction for both building model aircraft as well as flying these models. In most cases, a buddy box system is used at the flying field. Experience has shown this to be the safest method to learn.
