The August meeting was called to order by President Bryan Reightley at 6:28PM. Bryan announced the club officers:



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All seems to be going well at the field, no serious injuries that I have heard about. Everyone is behaving himself or herself. We do need to watch our pattern to the north. I see a lot of patterns that are getting near the landlord's house. The house is not nearly as far away as you would think.

Humans have their eyes set way to close together to be able to judge distance with any degree of accuracy. Yes, some of us are better judges of distance than others. The brain uses many things to give us a clue as to the distance of an object. Size is just one of them. But guess what, all airplanes are not the same size. While flying the other day, a Cessna 172 flew near the field. My airplane and the Cessna appeared to be about the same size. My plane was about 600 to 700 ft away and the Cessna was probably 5 or 6 times that distance away, but both airplanes looked about the same size. Bigger airplanes look closer than smaller ones. Had my airplane not been in the air, I would still have had a good idea how far away the Cessna was because I know the size of a Cessna 172. I could have been tricked had it been scale model.

Just for fun someday go out to the tree line and watch planes as they make approaches. You will find that a lot of them are on the other side of the tree line. But if you were to ask the pilot, they will swear they were on the field side of the tree line. This very thing happened to me. I thought I was on the field side of the tree line but a little south of the center line, when a tree reached out and grabbed my airplane and I realized differently! The plane was one of my bigger ones, so it looked bigger. My brain must have calculated that it was closer than it was. Another thing that may have been a

contributing factor was I had been flying a much smaller plane just before the fatal flight.

Remember Saturday, September 7th is the combat meet. This is where you will be able to see just how good you are at judging distance relative to two moving objects (airplanes). Luck is also a contributor to success in combat, but if you can't get close you're not going to get a cut.

Here are a couple things for thought:
A model, engine, or radio that is not prepared and working properly on the ground before takeoff will not improve in the air—IT WILL GET WORSE! There is no point in attempting to fly until everything is 100% correct. (Sig










Barnyard Buzzards Pilot Training

Our club is dedicated to the safe pursuit and advancement of model aviation. We offer the newcomer free lessons to learn how to build models and to fly them. If you should have any questions about the club, flight instruction or membership requirements, call any of the club officers. We have a safety checklist available for those new to our flying field.

Use of a computer simulator is advisable. This allows you to practice safely and will end up saving you hundreds of dollars in the long run.

Still, in any case, the best way to learn to fly R/C planes is by finding an instructor to help. Learning on your own can be expensive and somewhat less safe

We provide instruction for both building model aircraft as well as flying these models. In most cases, a buddy box system is used at the flying field. Experience has shown this to be the safest method to learn.

instructors to set up lessons.
