Safety Corner

Hello, everyone, and welcome to October. As the shorter days of fall approach, and with colder temperatures at the field, it is time to adjust our usual habits to the effects of cold weather on our equipment— particularly LiPo batteries and chargers, which tend to be more anemic in lower temperatures. Carry your charged LiPos in your coat pocket, or somewhere close to your body where they can retain their warmth prior to use.

Also, take care of your bare hands and feet! Such items as open-palm mittens and hand warmers come in handy, as well as warm boots. Some of us like to bring portable propane-fueled heaters and fire pits to the field. Always take the necessary precautions with open flames, and don't sit or stand too close!

As the days grow shorter, the sun tends to hang lower in the sky, so it is a good idea to avoid flying low in the south sky so you don't lose sight of your plane in the sun. If you have to make your approaches from the south, try to block the sun with your transmitter or your hat

brim if you can, so you don't get blinded by the glare.



Combat 2.7 Build Article Part 2) By Ron Swift













Well, I didn't complete the Combat 2.7 plane in time for the Combat Competition event. I did fly in the event with a Four Star 60 plane and the event was a lot of fun. Maybe next year I can use this plane.

Meanwhile the build has been continuing, although much slower.

I brought the fuselage out to the flying field and tested the Brison 3.2 engine. It started right up and ran with a lot of power (and noise). The fuselage is complete with elevator, rudder and throttle controls set up. Also the Opto engine shutoff and power switch for the ignition are done. The ignition battery and wiring is routed far away from the receiver system and no interference was noted. There is even more sawdust from all of the sanding as the main wing is nearing completion. The covering color scheme has yet to be decided and with an 81 inch wingspan and a chord of 20-inches, there is a lot of surface to cover. The 3-1/2 thick wing with the very round leading edge should make this plane fly well in high windy conditions, too!. There are a lot of covering materials in the shop to choose from with Monocote, Ultracote, Black Baron film and fabric among the covering choices. Boatloads of colors, too. Now if only the talent for covering using these materials would emerge, could be a good looking plane, too!

25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the <u>next right</u> to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the <u>left</u> at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, <u>be careful as on-</u> coming traffic does not stop.

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, <u>be careful as oncoming traffic does not</u> <u>stop</u>. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesinger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesinger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see the Red Barn and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the East side of the barn. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive...


