



## Safety Corner

I randomly asked several Buzzards if they knew what their aircraft would do if they shut off the transmitter while the motor was running. Surprisingly the large majority have no idea. I'm not suggesting you try this while in flight but this is something you need to test while the aircraft is secured on a bench.

If set correctly your radios failsafe system should stop the engine (electric or gas/glow) as soon as signal is lost. Most radios have the default failsafe setting set to "hold" a position when signal is lost, meaning wherever the controls were is how they will stay until signal is re-established. Some radios and ESC's will stop the engine if signal is lost but you still need to check this function. Some radios require you to rebind the receiver if you reverse the throttle channel, otherwise the failsafe will go the wrong way causing full throttle instead of no throttle when signal is lost.

There are many conditions that can occur where you lose signal. Be sure you understand how the failsafe works on your particular setup and make absolutely certain to test it!!

With the model secured on a bench or safe area, possibly with propellers or blades removed depending on circumstances, perhaps

with an assistant to help hold the model still, run the engine up and move the controls then turn the transmitter off. The motor should stop and flight controls move to neutral or safest position. If not.... you are not ready to fly it.

If you have built any model that survived, bring it to our club meeting October 11th. If you have a model that has never been in the builder's competition, you can bring it. The idea is to share building challenges and solutions and share some quality models. Even ARFs and drones can be entered, including boats and other stuff, even buildings for the tank track, etc.

Yep, some high quality prizes await those who have something unique, like modified landing gear, lights, tracks, decals, Whatever, please bring it - even if the mods didn't work out as expected. Yep, this will be a lot of fun and a learning experience

### 25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the <u>next right</u> to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the <u>left</u> at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, <u>be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.</u>

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the right. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive....
