### **Program**

#### Rebuilder's contest.

We had 4 entrants this year.

Ron Swift picked up a Flitecraft Bonanza A36 through Craigslist. It came with no horizontal stabilizer and the vertical stabilizer was rather flimsy. Ron built a new stabilizer and elevator from balsa and added a carbon fiber rod to the tail to add some lightweight rigidity. Ron has flown the aircraft and says it has very neutral flight characteristics with nearly same trim whether right side up or inverted.

John Rennert brought in a Twist, whose elevator linkage came disconnected in flight due to a nylon clevis being used with the wrong sized rod. The crash caused the fuse to break behind the main wing. Johns work was impressive with little sign that anything had ever happened to the Twist.

Chet brought his Radian. He had chosen the incorrect model when he started to fly. His thumb had rolled the model selection as he was entering his choice and selected the next model. This resulted in the elevator being reversed. The nose and the fuse above the main wing had broken. Chet used bamboo skewers to add some rigidity and strength to the repairs.

Tim Shegrud brought in his revamped Eaglet 50. After falling on the fuse of his previous Eaglet and having repaired the break many times, he decided that this last break would be the last. Rather than to fail once again at gluing and strengthening the break, he chose to replace the fuse

altogether. He noted that this is a stretch to call this a rebuild, but he is reusing the main wing, motor mount, and landing gear from the previous Eaglet 50.

The remaining members at the meeting voted John's Twist the winner. There really was little evidence of either damage or repair.

The meeting officially adjourned at 7:58 PM. The next meeting is Tuesday, Nov 12, 2013, at our Alfy's at 6:30 P M

# Safety Corner

All seems to be going well at the field, no serious injuries that I have heard about. Keep up the good work.

Remember that our benches and tables do not have any restraint to prevent the aircraft from moving backwards. Keep this in mind when starting your engine. This also applies to you electric fliers especially if you have had the speed controller and motor disconnected for any reason. Don't release the airplane until you are sure the engine (motor) is running the right way. If the airplane moves backwards don't panic and grab for the airplane. Remember we have that spinning thing up front and the sharper edge is leading when the engine is running backwards. It can really ruin your day if you reach out to stop the airplane and get your hand, arm or any other part of your anatomy in the prop. One way that will usually stop the engine is if you advance the throttle and then close it quickly. Of course you do have the transmitter placed so you can easily reach it, Right?? Using an electric starter will usually, but not always prevent the engine from starting backward. Be careful and know what is going on. When working on or around a running engine always keep your eyes where your hands are and don't get distracted. Also, remember that all work should be performed from behind the propeller.

Sometimes we luck out! Last Saturday my son (Eric) came up from Puyallup early in the morning. We loaded airplanes and all the stuff needed for the day of flying into the car. We met Chet and Dick at the Hitching Post Café for breakfast. If you remember the weather was not very good for flying, wind and rain and more wind and rain. So we

drank a lot of coffee and told stories. We decided the weather was not suitable for duckslet alone flying models. When we got home. Eric wanted to test run the engine that he had just installed into a new airplane. The engine had been on another airplane he retired. We set the plane on a table and secured it. It took a bit to get the engine to fire up, but after a new glow plug and some dinking around, we got it started. It was running and then started doing weird things, no throttle response and the control surfaces on the airplane were not responding. It was at this "weird things" stage that if we were at the field the airplane may have been in the air for its maiden flight and most likely its last flight. So what was wrong? Bad receiver, it was new? Bad transmitter it has been used for years? Actually none of the above. The battery was dead even though it was a nearly new battery that been formed with a dedicated NiMH battery former and then cycled on one of the newer type battery chargers,. It had been tested and recycled all normal. The change and discharge cycles all indicated normal. The only thing we could think of was that during the cycling process the charger was set to end on discharge and not the charge part of the cycle. I have been playing with the battery for a couple days and have found nothing abnormal with the battery.



Our club is dedicated to the safe pursuit and advancement of model aviation. We offer the newcomer free lessons to learn how to build models and to fly them. If you should have any questions about the club, flight instruction or membership requirements, call any of the club officers. We have a safety checklist available for those new to our flying field.

Use of a computer simulator is advisable. This allows you to practice safely and will end up saving you hundreds of dollars in the long run.

Still, in any case, the best way to learn to fly R/C planes is by finding an instructor to help. Learning on your own can be expensive and somewhat less safe

We provide instruction for both building model aircraft as well as flying these models. In most cases, a buddy box system is used at the flying field. Experience has shown this to be the safest method to learn.
