Safety Corner

Here it is again, that wonderful time of year when the leaves turn color and weather turns cooler. It is also known as the cold and flu season.

As you all know we don't allow Alcohol at the field. Of course that doesn't prevent you have a couple drinks and coming to the field. This is worse than having a Beer or two at the field, as you are driving to the field, flying and then driving home. DUI is not good for driving or flying but, there are other things that are just as bad.

Cold and allergy medications are just as bad as alcohol if not worse, they sneak-up on you. Even some of the over the counter drugs can have the same effect on your judgment. Take my word on this. Had it not been for another pilot in the right seat while making an ILS approach to Boeing Field one night, I may not be writing this. I had taken one of those multi purpose cold capsules before leaving Boise. When we got to Seattle I was feeling a little light headed but didn't think much of it. At the Boeing outer marker I set the airplane up for the approach Gear Down three green lights, and the rest of the checklist when we crossed the middle marker I look at the green lights and for some reason I

reached down and retracted the gear. Had it not been for the "WHAT THE H*** ARE YOU DOING" from the right seat, I most likely would have landed with the gear up. Needless to say I learned a lesson that night. Don't fly full scale, or RC after taking medication until you know how it will affect you.

Rebuilder's Competition











For the Rebuilder's Competition, the story behind the need to rebuild as well as the craftsmanship are important things for winning this event. Bryan Reightley started this competition years ago to encourage building skills and sharing the comradery for flying, the learning experiences for avoiding doing the same thing, sharing the lessons learned and highlighting the techniques for rebuilding the model.

This year we had 3 entries. Ron's VK Cherokee—flown at the Lewis Street facility years ago. It sported a heli version OS 61 2 stroke engine. It took off, went up about 50 feet and the engine quit. It glided like a rock! It crashed into Dale's Pine Trees tearing off the main wing, the bottom half of the fuselage and more! It won 1st.

Ted restructured the Slow Poke's landing gear after a few landings showed a poor design of the original kit. The new mounting block and aluminum gear replaces the weak wire ones originally provided.

Ron also brought a PT 40 kit that was crashed by one of his student pilots years ago. Seems like younger pilots just want to buy a new ARF and trash the old "slightly" damaged one. Ron rebuilt the fuselage and main wing, added a 4stroke engine, 2.4 GHz receiver and servos and the model flies just like new. The covering highlights the repaired areas.

Let's hope more Buzzards join in the fun for the 2017 Rebuilder's Competition October 2017!


25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

*** If you go the the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the next right to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the left at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going.

Turn right at the "T" intersection with Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, onto South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesinger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see the Red Barn and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the East side of the barn. Alfy's Pizza (our monthly meeting place) is along RT2 in the Staples plaza.
