Safety Corner

Here it is December already, what happened to summer? It seems as though it was just yesterday that we were talking about flying in the summer heat and using allergy medications and the effect they have on your ability to control an RC aircraft.

Now the heat is a thing of the past, we need to pay attention to the colder weather and the over-the -counter cold and flu medications. They have some of the same stuff in them that the allergy medications have in them. So let us not harp on this... just be aware they can have the same effect as the allergy meds have on our coordination and judgment.

There is a thing called Wind Chill. You say "I don't fly in winter with the wind blowing because it is too cold"! That may be true, however there is a chart called Wind Chill Chart (WCC)--Funny how that works. The WCC tells us if it 35°F and the wind is blowing 10mph it will feel like 27°F. OK that's not too bad, however your fingers will get really cold in a 10 minute flight assuming no protection (gloves). I personally find it hard to fly while wearing gloves. Thin silk gloves work very well you can get them at an army surplus store or at least you could a few years back. The Air Force issued them as glove liners. Maybe there is something available at REI or ski shops. You guys tell me if you know of something that you have tried and like. OK back to the Wind Chill Chart.

Let's say it is real cold and nice clear day, of course, you have to go flying. Let's say it's 10°F and you reach back to adjust the high speed needle valve and wind from the prop is 60 MPH. This is going to be down right uncomfortable the WCC indicates –19°F and you have about 10 minutes before frostbite.

Remember to dress in layers, wear gloves, wear a hat (a lot of body heat is lost from your head) and wear shoes that will keep your feet warm and most importantly dry.

By the way, if you wander off Mark's path and bridge and fall into one of the many streams that we have available in the field that we fly over and get yourself wet, your body core temperature will take a nose dive and you will wish that all you had to think about is the WCC above when you get some exposed skin in the prop blast.

Who has the right-of-way???? Every kid knows Santa has the right of way! That should also includes us older kids.

Rebuilder's Competition












For the Rebuilder's Competition, the story behind the need to rebuild as well as the craftsmanship are important things for winning this event. Bryan Reightley started this competition years ago to encourage building skills and sharing the comradery for flying, the learning experiences for avoiding doing the same thing, sharing the lessons learned and highlighting the techniques for rebuilding the model.

This year we had 3 entries. Ron's VK Cherokee—flown at the Lewis Street facility years ago. It sported a heli version OS 61 2 stroke engine. It took off, went up about 50 feet and the engine quit. It glided like a rock! It crashed into Dale's Pine Trees tearing off the main wing, the bottom half of the fuselage and more! It won 1st.

Ted restructured the Slow Poke's landing gear after a few landings showed a poor design of the original kit. The new mounting block and aluminum gear replaces the weak wire ones originally provided.

Ron also brought a PT 40 kit that was crashed by one of his student pilots years ago. Seems like younger pilots just want to buy a new ARF and trash the old "slightly" damaged one. Ron rebuilt the fuselage and main wing, added a 4stroke engine, 2.4 GHz receiver and servos and the model flies just like new. The covering highlights the repaired areas.

Let's hope more Buzzards join in the fun for the 2017 Rebuilder's Competition October 2017!


25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

*** If you go the the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the next right to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the left at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going.

Turn right at the "T" intersection with Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, onto South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesinger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see the Red Barn and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the East side of the barn. Alfy's Pizza (our monthly meeting place) is along RT2 in the Staples plaza.
