



"Take It Easy"

If you've been in the hobby for any length of time, you have no doubt run across at least one or two guys who seem to have something to prove. You know what I mean. There are guys who perform radical maneuvers because they like doing the fancy stuff with their models, and then there are those guys who fly like their hair is on fire because other guys are watching. You can tell the difference by sensing the demeanor of the audience. A calm and relaxed crowd that can enjoy the spectacle without cringing at the close calls is a big tell. It's the level of confidence among the observers that is the measure of competence of the pilot.

Maybe there is something in all of us that dreams of being able to handle any maneuver with the nonchalant confidence of a pro 3D flyer. We would all like to be the next Quique Somenzini or Andrew Jesky, but some guys just don't understand that getting there takes a long time and a lot of disciplined practice. Until you pay the price for the necessary skillset, the wild and crazy stuff is a hazard to people and property.

I remember once, when my home field was being threatened out of existence by some hungry real estate developers. I was tempted to try out a renegade field in a nearby industrial park. It was close to where I lived, and on the way to and from work, so the convenience of the location was too good to pass up. I had been warned by others, though, that the small group of guys that flew there tended to be reckless—no club, no rules, no prohibitions. Holy cow, was I in for a surprise!


My first day out was crazy beyond all belief. When I got there, they were playing follow the leader directly overhead. They were flying three to five airplanes at a time, all at full throttle. There were touch-and-goes off the dirt right next to the parked cars. They were starting their engines and launching in whatever direction they happened to choose, without first checking for other airplanes in the air or on the ground. I noticed that there was not one nice airplane in the group—all were tired and worn out and patched many times over. I left while they were setting up a pyramid of empty pop cans for some low-pass target practice. When the place finally got shut down, these guys all matriculated back into the local clubs. I tried to remember their faces, in case I ever had to fly alongside them again.

This experience really enlightened me to the importance of establishing a code of conduct when operating R/C airplanes, and why clubs must lay down rules and procedures that are enforced with appropriate diligence. Some clubs become obsessed with enforcing rules, to the point of taking all of the enjoyment right out of the hobby. It can get so bad that they inadvertently chase people away. For this reason, some level of prudence and geniality needs to prevail when enforcing club rules.

I believe the Barnyard Buzzards club has done an excellent job of creating a setting of gentlemanly courtesy between the participating pilots at the field, where all feel welcome and all feel the responsibility to comport themselves in harmony with the other members of the club. We have some excellent pilots in our club, and it is enriching to watch them do their stuff, and to date I have not seen any irresponsible behavior among any of our club members. Way to go, guys!

So how should we deal with a pilot who is getting reckless? There's no need to holler from the pits and embarrass the guy. Often it just takes a moment of persuasion. I remember one seasoned old guy in a past club, who walked out to the flight line one day and stood next to a yearling pilot who was doing endless snap rolls over the runway, and getting pretty close to the pits. The old guy watched for a bit, then said to the young pilot "I see you got the hard stuff down pretty good--- but can you fly perfectly straightand-level down the entire length of the runway at pattern height?" The kid spent the rest of the afternoon flying up and down the length of the runway, over and over again, until his lines became nice and straight. The old guy was teaching the new kid a lesson in learning to "take it easy".



25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the next right to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the left at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesinger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see the Red Barn and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the East side of the barn. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive...
