Ward brought his large scale Space Walker and showed how to paint the checkered pattern on the pre painted tail and ailerons using precision cut 1" squares of clear shelf covering and placing on the area corner point to point, then paint over them with opposite color, allow to tack up and remove the squares. Beautiful and tedious job.

Mark brought his Gremlin that suffered a broken fuselage at the motor mount. He secured the necessary 2 1/2" heavy wall down spout material, built a motor mount and remounted the engine. He noticed the engine wouldn't turn over completely. He found that in the crash, a connecting rod had broken which he had to

repair.



### "Helping the New Guy"

Once in awhile a new guy comes along in this hobby, with no prior flight experience, and in dire need of some flight training to get him started. It takes a special sort of modeler to volunteer for the responsibility of training a neophyte pilot. Not everyone is up for the job, whether it be for lack of seasoned experience, lack of free time out at the field, or lack of patience! I've had my turn at training new pilots, and I was really surprised at the level of dedication and determination it can require. Sometimes you wonder who is being challenged more--- the student, or the instructor!

But all of us understand that to let a new guy go off and learn with no assistance can be imprudent, if not downright dangerous! If you decide you are up for the job of filling the role of flight instructor for a beginner in the hobby, here are some things to consider:

Your first task is to figure out how much your student knows. Hand them the transmitter and ask them to show you how to make the airplane climb. If they hold the tranny up to their face and push the right stick "up" (forward), you've got some basics to cover. (You'd be amazed how many people think the stick goes "up" to make the model go up.) Before any flying is done, the student needs to practice the basics of the control functions on the ground, where it is safe to make mistakes. Now is a good time to teach them about apparent control reversal when the model is flying toward the pilot. Guys who have some R/C car experience will understand this right away.

Pick an appropriate airplane for training. Warbirds are right out. Gliders are always a good choice, but any typical high-wing trainer airplane should do the job for you. If the student doesn't have a good plane for learning, discuss this essential item with him, or loan him one of yours.

Don't belabor the complex physics of flight. Aero principles will come with time, and are not essential for learning the basics of operating an airplane. Save the discussions about adverse yaw and pitch vs. airspeed for the more advanced lessons later on.


You will do the first take-offs and landings. The idea is to give the student some self-confidence by allowing them to learn to fly straight and level, and progress to gentle turns on their first day out.

Trainer cords are a great way to go, but it shouldn't give you license to allow the student to get into risky, scary situations with his new plane.

Try not to talk too much. This can lead to confusion and information overload. Allow the student to fly in silence as much as possible, while they internalize what is going on with their model. Use a gentle voice, and suggest more aileron rather than barking it out, so that they can develop a smooth touch and a confident reaction without getting alarmed or tense.

Finally, it is up to you to know how far to advance your student with each session. A beginner may not be ready yet for that first landing, but often they will go through with it anyway, based on your recommendation. Leave your ego at home—this is about the new guy's abilities, not yours. Be kind, with no judgments or expectations, so that their trust in you will be implicit. Let them show signs of confidence first, before attempting any new challenge. Remember that no two people are alike. Some guys can learn to fly in one day, and others spend years learning to fly without ever really

mastering it like a pro. The reward of all of this is to see your student evolve to the point where one day he is helping some other new guy, and your satisfaction will be in the paying forward of a selfless favor.

### 25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the next right to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the left at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesinger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesinger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see the Red Barn and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the East side of the barn. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive...


Each meeting starts with an introduction of the club officers followed by a short business meeting. Next we have a **program** about some aspect of the hobby/sport.
