Sandy has been working with a couple of the other wives to plan for the Christmas party. It would be nice if we could get the entire room for the party as last year, we were a bit cramped. We have set a \$25.00 Max on the gift exchange presents. There will be a member's table and a wife's table. If you bring a gift to exchange, you place the gift on the designated table and will get a raffle ticket. We will draw numbers for the order of gift selection. It was asked how many significant others would be at the party. Right now, there may be seven to eight wives at the party. The question was asked about desserts; Steve Higgins offered to bring Christmas-themed cupcakes. Mark Weeks said he would get something. The club is going to supply pizza and soda for the membership.

Secretary:

Treasurer:

Money is good. All bills are paid. We then went over the 2024 Budget. The annual nonprofit report with the state was submitted. The Donation check for the food bank was given to Ron so he could take it to the Sky Valley Food Bank. The 2024 Budget was reviewed. We also went over itemized expenses in 2023. We spent a good amount of funds on field improvements. Some costs have gone up over time. Questions: Food expenses clumped to 6 events throughout the year. Some events, like boats and floats, are complex due to not having the BBQ and other items like we would have at the field. The plan is to designate five events to have food ahead of time. The sixth event with food is the Christmas party budget. What was the insurance cost? This is the AMA club insurance that we are required to have. A few months ago, we investigated secondary insurance, which was much more expensive than expected. The new board will look at the events' schedule in December. If you want to do an event, please talk to a board member, or when the newly revamped website



is online, it will make scheduling events on short notice easier. In 2011-2013, due to the field construction and moving field the dues were \$100.00. In 2014 dues were dropped to \$90.00 With looking at the higher expenses and the projects in the pipeline the board proposed that dues are upped to: Full Member \$100.00; Student \$30.00; and Family \$50.00 A motion was made and seconded. After a very short discussion a vote on the motion was held passed 14-2 in approval to raise the dues for the 2024 year.

Safety Officer:

Vince hasn't been out to the field in a while. He hasn't seen anyone getting hurt. It's wet and cold, but everyone is staying safe.

Field Manager:

The field is wet off the runway... the field is getting soggy. With that said, the field is greening up and filling in. One more mow in December we should be good until spring, where we will continue to overseed and fertilize to improve the condition of the field. Dart got a semi-free load of gravel and topped off the clubhouse gravel. Dart said it worked out great, he backed in, dumped the rock and called Brian Douma... when he got back Brian had had shoveled the gravel into the clubhouse.

Safety Corner Bell

Here it is December already, what happened to summer? It seems as though it was just yesterday that we were talking about flying in the summer heat and using allergy medications and the effect they have on your ability to control an RC aircraft. Now the heat is a thing of the past, we need to pay attention to the colder weather and the over-thecounter cold and flu medications. They have some of the same stuff in them that the allergy medications have in them. So let us not harp on this... just be aware they can have the same effect as the allergy meds have on our coordination and judgment.

Instead, there is a thing called Wind Chill. You say "I don't fly in winter with the wind blowing because it is too cold"! That may be true, however there is a chart called Wind Chill Chart (WCC)--Funny how that works. The WCC tells us if it is 35° F and the wind is blowing 10mph it will feel like 27° F. OK that's not too bad, however your fingers will get really cold in a 10 minute flight assuming no protection (gloves).

I personally find it hard to fly while wearing gloves. Thin silk gloves work very well you can get them at most any Military surplus store or at least you could a few years back. The Air Force issued them as glove liners. Maybe there is something available at REI or ski shops. You guys tell me if you know of something that you have tried and like.

OK back to the Wind Chill Chart. Let's say it is real cold and nice clear day, of course, you have to go flying. Let's say it's 10°F and you reach back to

adjust the high speed needle valve or keep your batteries warm and wind from the prop is 60 MPH. This is going to be downright uncomfortable the WCC indicates -19°F and you have about 10 minutes before frostbite sets in. Remember to dress in layers, wear gloves, wear a hat (65% of body heat is lost from your head) as the head is where the major heat is lost, especially if you lost your fur! So wear a hat and wear shoes that will keep your feet warm and most importantly dry. By the way, if you wander off Mark's path and bridge and fall into one of the many streams that we have available in the field that we fly over getting yourself wet, your body core temperature will take a nose dive. Hopefully you brought a change of clothes this time! You'll wish that all you had to think about is the WCC above when you get some exposed skin in the prop blast or high gusty wind.

Next subject: Who has the right-ofway ???? Every kid knows Santa has the right of way! That should also include us older kids.



Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).



If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the <u>next right</u> to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the <u>left at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek</u> Road, <u>be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.</u>

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, <u>be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop</u>. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the right. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive....


