The gate entrance was reconfigured to allow for easier entry and exit to the field, especially for club members with larger vehicles. A nice bonus is that you can see the Barnyard Buzzards sign when the gate is closed as you round the corner at the top of the hill.

On the weekend of the February 24th they also put some work into the car track. They have laid out the car track that removed most of the "Dead" space and makes more space for racing. This also opened up about 150+ square feet of space for the tank area.

This gate is set up on wheels so we can open and close it when not in use. The sensor system will be attached to the underside of the swinging gate for ease of installation. Two Faux walls open up to allow the gate to open or close. For those interested in racing, the club does have sensors for sale; Michael will have the timing sensors for purchase (\$30.00) at the next business meeting, and we can order more if there is more demand for these sensors as we go forward.

Safety Corner

March has arrived. And with it comes warmer weather, nicer conditions, and events starting up.

We're getting antsy as the outlook is brighter to head out to the field.

This means that it's time to check your equipment out. Check your batteries to see how they've faired over the winter break.

Especially those Spektrum Smart batteries. The self discharging batteries. If you find a dead Spektrum, as I have, there are YouTubes on how to resurrect them. It doesn't always work, however, it's worth a try.

Make sure to do this in an area where you are not going to damage anything in case of the battery igniting. I set up on a an outdoor table.

Use a battery bag if you have them. Accidents happen.

Also, look over your battery connectors, ser-

vos and linkage.

Lubricate what needs lubricating, check all of your fasteners and use Locktite when appropriate.

We spend a lot of money on this hobby, and it is always disappointing when a step is missed, a part comes loose, or a servo is reversed and you are taking the "walk of shame."

As of this writing, no injuries, mishaps or safety concerns have been reported.

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).



If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the <u>next right</u> to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the <u>left</u> at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, <u>be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.</u>

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the right. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive....
