# Safety Corner

Spring has sprung. With the season comes more field activity.

One of the occurrences with more people is distraction.

Paying attention to what you're doing while in conversation with fellow flyers is paramount for an injury free day.

Stay mindful of your propeller. An injury from a blade strike is quite often a trip to an ER.

We are located quite a distance from any such place. My search shows Monroe as the closest location to our field. That would be a long, painful drive.

Always remember to do what you can to prevent getting bit by your prop.

My recommendations? Do any of these that fit your scenario.

Unplug your motor,

Take your prop off,

Set up a motor cut-off switch on your transmitter,

Or just be mindful of the arc of the prop if your task requires a turning prop.

Mark the ends of the propeller with red or other noticeable color.

Never reach across the prop for any reason. Walk around. It's worth it.

As of this writing, no injuries, mishaps, or safety concerns have been reported.

As always, if you see something that concerns you, reach out to me.

### 25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).



**If you go the left as shown by MapQuest,** make sure you take the <u>next right</u> to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the <u>left</u> at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, <u>be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.</u>

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the gate on the right. It seems complicated, but once you come out, you'll see it is an easy drive....
