
PROGRAM:

This is the time of year where some forego the field and concentrate on our projects at home. Be it a "honey do" list or a pet project we've desired starting, continuing or completing. Maybe a model or two that need repairs or modifications.

Most likely, we'll need to be using tools to complete these tasks.

Reading back issues of the newsletter, I found that previous Safety Officers have addressed the need for care in using tools to work on projects. Razor knives were the common theme on these posts. So, here is my take on this subject:

Be mindful of what you're doing and which tools you're using to complete whichever task you're attempting.




25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the <u>next right</u> to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the <u>left</u> at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the
