There were many great stories shared. Thanks to all those who shared.


Show and Tell:

Greetings Barnyard Buzzards,

Weather has been improving and so it is natural to start thinking of going back out to get some air time. I can't wait, but first, I'll need to take care of winter clean up and spring prep.

I'd like to take the time to remind the club members that our personal safety and the safety of our fellow members is our very first consideration. Safety also involves our models and equipment according to the AMA.

We made it through last year without any injuries. That in itself was a fantastic feat considering what we're dealing with. Sharp spinny things, explosive batteries, projectiles. You get the drift.

Let's make an effort to keep this trend going throughout 2025 and beyond.

Make sure that your equipment is in good order. That you've checked all control surface directions.

Make sure to call out your intentions as it pertains to launching your aircraft. And if you're present at flight line and you can hear when someone calls out? Acknowledge that you've heard them. Don't be shy!

And definitely call out your intention to retrieve your aircraft from the runway.



25600 Monroe Camp Road, Snohomish, WA

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the <u>next right</u> to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the <u>left</u> at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, <u>be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.</u>

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the
