We need a couple more water hoses or hard pipe to run water to the car track area. If you would like to help or have old hoses please drop them off.



Safety Corner

Greetings Barnyard Buzzards,

6 months in and it's looking to start to get warm. At the time of this writing, I'm visiting family in mid Illinois. The temperature here is 80s and 90s. And humid.

High daytime temperatures can negatively impact LiPo (Lithium Polymer) batteries, potentially leading to decreased capacity, increased internal resistance, accelerated aging, and even a risk of thermal runaway. Here's a more detailed explanation:

Negative Effects of High Temperatures Reduced Capacity:

LiPo batteries may hold less charge at high temperatures, meaning shorter flight times or operating durations.

Increased Internal Resistance:

Heat increases the internal resistance of the battery, leading to voltage drops and reduced power output during discharge.

Accelerated Aging:

High temperatures speed up chemical reactions within the battery, causing faster degradation and a shorter overall lifespan.

Risk of Thermal Runaway:

Exposing LiPo batteries to excessive heat can lead to thermal runaway, where the battery rapidly overheats and potentially catches fire or explodes.

Temperature Guidelines for LiPo Batteries: Storage:

Store LiPo batteries in a cool, dry place between 20 C and 25 C (68 F to 77 F) to maintain capacity and prevent degradation.

Operating:

Operating temperatures should ideally be within the manufacturer's specified range (often between -20 C to 60 C or -4 F to 140 F), but it's best to avoid extreme temperatures.

Charging:

Charge LiPo batteries at room temperature (below 35 C or 95 F), using the manufacturer's recommended charger and ensuring the battery temperature does not exceed 45 C (113 F) during charging.

Discharging:

Discharge LiPo batteries within the recommended temperature range, which is typically 45 C or 113 F.

Preventing Issues in Hot Weather-

Avoid Direct Sunlight:

Do not leave LiPo batteries under direct sunlight, as this can cause them to overheat.

Cool Storage:

Store LiPo batteries in a cool, shaded place when not in use.

Proper Handling:

Be careful when handling LiPo batteries, especially during charging and discharging, to avoid overheating.

Always use a charging bag while charging LiPo

batteries. There are bags in the clubhouse for use while at the field.

Camp Edward and the Hanner's Memorial Field are located north of Monroe, Washington in Snohomish County. The most common route is from Highway 2 in Monroe near Albertson's. Turn north onto Woods Creek Road. As you travel north on Woods Creek Road, it will come to a Y intersection, stay to the right (Yeager Rd).

If you go the left as shown by MapQuest, make sure you take the <u>next right</u> to stay on Woods Creek Road. Then stay to the <u>left</u> at the intersection where Yeager rejoins Woods Creek Road, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop.

Yeager will rejoin Woods Creek Road at a 4-way intersection. Stay straight-ish, not a hard right, be careful as oncoming traffic does not stop. In a few miles you will pass the entrance to Camp Pigott. Keep going. Turn right at the "T" intersection at Lake Roesiger Road. At the next "Y" intersection, stay right, staying on South Lake Roesiger Road. Turn right at Monroe Camp Road, (Lake Roesiger Store will be on the left). In about a mile, the road will fork again, stay straight. After a short distance you will see our club sign and our gate. Our parking is past the
